This week we farewell Fr Gersio who came to the parish from Timor Leste to support us the last few months.

We are grateful to Fr Gersio for his expression of faith, all the masses he celebrated, and for his gentle nature; and we pray for his pastoral service as he serves the Salesian Australia-Pacific province.

"I'm going fishing" ... "Follow me"

Coincidentally, as the Church is preparing for the conclave to elect the next Pope, the Bishop of Rome, the apostolic successor to St Peter, this Sunday's Gospel reading focusses on Peter's encounter with the risen Lord that becomes a moment of grace, deep transformation and commitment.

In the first scene of today's Gospel passage, Peter tells his friends, "I am going fishing," and thus, he goes back to his old way of life. Six of his friends join him. They return to fishing, but caught nothing. At dawn, Jesus meets Peter and the other disciples on the shore, miraculously providing a great catch of fish. This moment is more than just about fishing; it symbolizes fruitfulness that comes from following the Lord's direction and trusting in his grace.

In the second scene, Jesus invites his disciples to breakfast. This simple yet profound gesture reveals Jesus' deep care and love for his disciples. This moment reflects Jesus' servant-hearted nature – the Son of God, risen in glory, still humbly prepares a meal for his friends. He meets their most basic human need and welcomes them into fellowship. It becomes a lesson in leadership for Peter. By serving his disciples, Jesus demonstrates that *true leadership is rooted in care, humility, and service.*

The third scene presents Jesus asking Peter three times, "Do you love me?" Each question mirrors Peter's threefold denial, offering him the opportunity to reaffirm his love. Jesus then commands him to "Feed my lambs," "Look after my sheep," and "Feed my sheep" – an obvious call to lead and care for his people. This moment reminds Peter that to love the Lord means to do his will and to be a shepherd after the Lord's own heart.

This whole encounter with the risen Lord becomes a turning point in Peter's life. The risen Christ doesn't just heal his past failures, but shapes him into the leader he is meant to be. He moves from confusion to clarity, fear to courage, denial to devotion, ultimately becoming the unwavering foundation of the early Church.

This experience of St Peter is a beautiful reminder to every leader of the Church and every disciple of Christ that *grace transforms* – Jesus meets us where we are, transforms us, and entrusts us with his mission. He redirects our path – from following our own plans ("I'm going fishing") to embracing his will ("Follow me").

May the next Pope be encouraged by St Peter's experience of the transforming grace of the Lord!
