"Sir, will only a few be saved?"

The question, "Sir, will only a few be saved?" (Luke 13:23), touches a deep chord in the human heart. However, Jesus doesn't answer the question directly, instead, he shifts the focus from curiosity about others to personal responsibility: "Try your best to enter by the narrow door" (Luke 13:24). In doing so, Jesus invites us not to speculate, but to act with intent. In other words, salvation requires effort, commitment, and perseverance. It is not a passive journey but an active pursuit. As the American educator Hamilton Holt once said, "Nothing worthwhile comes easily. Work, continuous work and hard work, is the only way to accomplish results that last."

And while the door may be narrow, Jesus reminds us that salvation is open to all who seek God with genuine hearts: "People will come from east and west, from north and south, and will take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God" (Luke 13:29). In this, Jesus echoes the words of Yahweh spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "I am coming to gather the nations of every language" (Isaiah 66:18). This reveals that God desires the salvation of all.

But what is salvation? It is a return to God. It is a return to paradise, where perfect harmony once existed between God and His creation. Salvation is about entering into communion with God, the origin of all that is. Yet it is not only a vertical relationship; it also calls us to build communion with our brothers and sisters here and now. When we live in unity with God and with one another, we begin to embody our true nature – not just as human beings, but as spiritual beings fully alive.

General Audience – A Summary

Dear brothers and sisters, in our catechesis on the Jubilee theme of "Christ our Hope," we continue to reflect on Jesus' passion, death and resurrection by considering his forgiving love. Despite his betrayal, Jesus loves his disciples until the end: he washes their feet, and even offers a morsel of bread to his betrayer in one last attempt to demonstrate that love. This morsel, in fact, signifies that God does everything possible to reach us in order to offer his love and forgiveness. While never denying that evil exists or acting as if bad things do not happen in this world, the example of Jesus shows us that true forgiveness does not wait for contrition but is offered first as a gift. When we experience wounds and betrayal, let us ask for the grace to offer true forgiveness, even when we feel misunderstood and abandoned, or even when it seems to be in vain. In this way, may we know the freedom and peace that comes from a loving and forgiving heart.
