"We feed everyone"

"We feed everyone" is a quote from parishioner Wayne Matautia when he presented at the *Vibrant Parishes* forum run by the archdiocese, on Wednesday evening. This event was part of *Take the Way of the Gospel*, an archdiocese initiative in response to Pope Francis' call for Church life to move away from self-preservation, towards actively sharing the Gospel. This particular forum focused on helping parishes in reaching beyond the Church doors. As part of this, Wayne was invited to present the Parish Food Outreach Program that he and his family hold at St Joseph's monthly.

The other PPC members present at this event saw a touching and thoughtful account from Wayne, who showed compassion in feeding the hungry as Jesus did. Wayne believes God gave him and his family the skills to serve, so they can love through food. Thank you to Wayne and his family.

Following Jesus is a Choice!

"Do you suppose that I am here to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." These words of Jesus in Luke 12:51 can feel unsettling. How can the one hailed as the "Prince of Peace" speak of bringing division? This paradox invites us into the deeper reality of discipleship: following Jesus is not a passive pursuit of comfort, but a radical reorientation of allegiance that often challenges the status quo.

Following Jesus and his teachings is a choice we make. Consequently, such a choice means embracing Jesus' way of living which often is not popular and sometimes countercultural. While choosing Jesus can transform one's personal life, it can also invite opposition from within one's family and society. The radical commitment to live the kingdom values taught by Jesus can cause tension when others don't share the same values. Hence, "division" isn't Jesus' goal, but a consequence of people choosing whether or not to follow him.

However, every follower of Jesus is not called to deepen the divide, but to bridge it. This means embodying the love that listens, the grace that forgives, and the truth that stands firm without arrogance. Let's be peacemakers.

A Vocation Reflection

Hello everyone, my name is Afia Enosa from Samoa. I would like to share a brief story of what leads me in my vocational discernment today as a Salesian of Don Bosco. My vocation began with a profound sense of divine inspiration, guided by the Salesians of Don Bosco (Both Salesian Sisters and Fathers). Their steadfast commitment to serving the youth and embodying the love of Jesus helped me in my quest to understand the purpose of God in my life. Growing up at home was never easy. I faced many limitations in opportunities and resources, which often made me question my path and my future. Their support and example help me discern what God has planned for my life, and I pray for the grace to remain faithful to the call that I have been called. My journey is ongoing, but I am confident that God's guidance will lead me to fulfill His purpose.
