## The Grace of Gratitude

Over the past couple of months, our parish office has received heart-warming messages of gratitude. These notes remind us of the deep joy and connection that come from serving one another in faith.

Here are just a few:

Dear Father, Virginia and Rafelina, I just wanted to thank you for a wonderful Baptism for our daughter Maximilia... Thank you all.

Thank you Father and St John's Church for celebrating with me my Holy Communion.

Thank you... for welcoming me and my mother to your community. I'm excited to continue my journey with Jesus. Thank you.

God bless Fr Cassius and all our dear Salesians. We thank God for you and appreciate your time and kindness.

These expressions of gratitude uplift our hearts and inspire us to give even more generously. They also remind us that every opportunity to serve is a gift from God. This is what the prophet Elisha teaches us in his encounter with Naaman.

When Naaman is healed of leprosy, he returns to offer Elisha a gift. Elisha refuses, making it clear that the healing was not his doing; it was God's. Naaman responds with faith, declaring, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel." Like Elisha, we are not the source of healing or help, but vessels through which God's mercy flows.

In the Gospel story of the ten lepers (Luke 17:11–19), all ten encounter the source of healing, yet only one, the Samaritan, returns to give thanks. In doing so, he receives not only physical healing but also the gift of spiritual wholeness. Jesus affirms this by saying, "Your faith has saved you."

These biblical narratives remind us that gratitude completes the miracle. It transforms a moment of mercy into a relationship of faith. When we receive thanks, we are reminded to pass it on - to the One who makes all things new and whose healing and love extend beyond boundaries.

Gratitude, whether received or offered, is a sacred exchange. It reminds us that we are part of something greater - a divine movement of love, healing, and grace. And at the heart of it all is our loving Lord, who rejoices with us, hears our cries, heals our wounds, and deserves our deepest thanks.
