

Sanctifying every moment of life

Today we begin a new Liturgical year: the Liturgical Year 2025-2026. Along with celebrating the Liturgical "New Year", we also begin a new Advent season.

Advent has two practical characteristics:

- 1. A season of preparation for the celebration of Christmas, remembering the incarnation of the Son of God.
- 2. A season in which, through that remembrance, we are invited to turn our hearts to look forward to Christ's second coming at the end of the world.

On the first day of Advent, which is also the first day of the Liturgical year, the Church, through the Word of God, reminds us to prepare ourselves spiritually to await the coming of the Lord. It was a day of surprise, a day as terrifying as the great flood in the Old Testament:

"As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark; and they knew nothing until the flood came and took them all away; so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man."

According to Matthew, the people of Noah's time did not commit any sin. They only did normal things: "eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage." They died in the flood, not because they were sinful, but because they did not sanctify every moment and every work. They did not do things in the spirit of prayer, in the love of God...

In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us to always be ready because He will come at any time. Our readiness is not like that of Noah, but according to God's will. That is, in the midst of a worldly life full of troubles, hardships, and worries, we must trust and rely on God.

Cardinal Francis Savie Nguyen Van Thuan, a man of hope, set an excellent example in living and sanctifying the present moment. He said: "I only have one most beautiful moment: the present moment, living in the love of God completely; my life will be beautiful. I find it simple, not difficult." (Road of Hope #997). The more the Cardinal lived in hope, the more he tried to sanctify the present moment.

On August 15, 1975, as soon as he was arrested, he felt disappointed and lonely because he could no longer practice the pastoral work of a diocesan shepherd. But soon after, the Cardinal realized that a prisoner like him could not wait for any future. He decided: Only sanctify and live the present moment. He made the present moment filled with love.

The past is gone, the future is ahead, only the present is within our reach. The present moment is ready to accompany us, helping us to realise all our dreams, carry out all our actions in life and for life.

Like the Cardinal, accepting Jesus' call to be awake, let us thoroughly sanctify and live our present moment well. Even though we have struggles, worries, works, ups and downs, we still see God present with us, and we are before God and in God. Living with God always like that, we are ready, awake, waiting for the day of the Lord. Every moment of being ready and awake shows that we are living intensely in hope in God. Fr Anthony sdb
