Christmas is for Growth into Adulthood

Dressed in a garment of camel hair and feeding on locusts and wild honey, John the Baptist gives a new meaning to words like fashion and diet. At the same time, unconcerned by political correctness, his statement is clear and disturbingly fiery: change or perish! The radical nature of John's proclamation and demand is matched only by his radical attire and lifestyle. His eye-catching behaviour is but an outward proclamation of his message; a statement leaving no doubt about the radical nature and absolute urgency of his call. His demeanour is fierce and his message fiery, as he challenges the status quo and the false expectations of those who feel secure in their personal agenda and with their self-styled Messiah.

John's message is one of 'God-with-us' and lack of awareness of this *Presence* here and now is the raison d'être of our Christmas celebration. The lack of this awareness destroys the very concept of Christmas, making a lie of our claim to faith whether we engage in festive orgies or not. John's expected Messiah is not someone far away in time and place, but One right here and now. Whether mingling with the same anonymous crowd or sharing the same cultural and religious rituals John points to a Messiah experiencing the same flow of time and years as we do, right here and now. Unrecognized maybe, yet actively present in our midst, living the very life advent-ure we live, doing what we do, and undergoing the very same process we undergo an eternal presence that takes the shape and flow of our individual lives and collective story.

Once we accept this sense of Awareness, our lives become a Reflection of this presence and a lived and living Proclamation in our here and now. Celebrating Advent and Christmas leave no choice but to confront our reality, challenge our values, accept our limitations, and charter a new course of action in the journey of life. John uses words of fire to awaken total and absolute Conversion calling those satisfied with a personally styled rituals a brood of vipers, fruitless and dead branches destined for total destruction, and imposters who equate faith to belonging to a race, traditions or an exclusive club. He is relentless in condemning self-satisfaction and in his demands for change, because conversion is the only acceptable way of making room for God who yearns to enter our lives. If we celebrate Advent and Christmas, then things must change and be different, beginning with a total reversal of perceptions, of assumed values and of lived relationships and behaviour.

Does John's call find any resonance in us who claim belief in 'God-with-us'? In the midst of the hectic rush of the next few weeks, as we look at the plastic figurines of the crib, let us allow that presence to transform us and have the courage to look at ourselves and accept the call to review and renew our lives. Then Christmas will truly be that celebration of human and divine interaction which it was always meant to be: a commitment for us to grow into God and let God grow in us!
